



Coronavirus (COVID-19) catch-up premium

Total amount of premium	£44,560.
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How the fund will be spent

- **Increasing teaching capacity**
Additional part time teacher (0.5) to be employed in Year 2 to deliver daily targeted support for English and maths.
- **Increase of teaching assistant capacity**
Additional teaching assistant to be employed in Reception to deliver the Nuffield Early Language Intervention Programme.
- **Purchase Reading Plus**
Targeted intervention programme to develop fluency and comprehension in Key Stage 2.
- **Purchase MyMaths**
An interactive online teaching and homework website to support same day, responsive intervention, build pupil engagement and consolidates maths knowledge.
- **Purchase Education City**
Bespoke intervention programme which pupils can access in school and at home.
- **National Tutoring Programme**
To recruit 2 full time tutors for the summer term to support 173 pupils (84% eligible for FSM). Each pupil will receive the maximum 15 hours of additional targeted support in Maths or English, in groups no larger than 3.
- **Purchase of technology to support pupils to access additional learning**
128 chrome books and 30 additional ipads have been purchased using funding from the Diocese and the Lord Crew Charity. The DfE have provided 88 Windows tablets and 32 laptops to support remote learning.

How will the impact of the fund on educational attainment be assessed?

- Pupils have been assessed and identified as needing to catch up lost ground compared to their peers in English and maths. Year 2 has been identified as a priority year group for additional support, following a model that was successfully implemented in Year 6 last year.
- Pupils will be assessed periodically to check that they are making up lost ground.
- Assessment will be by using teacher judgement using the Gateshead Assessment Profile, supported by NFER standardised tests.
- In reading, we assess our pupils termly, using the STAR reading test.
